### Kindergarten:

We continue to work on reading, writing and our literacy skills. We are working on subtraction! (or as one kindergartener said... "OH! You mean take-away!")

The students are excited to be back after spring break. They LOVE to see their friends! We are revisiting be respectful, be responsible, be safe, and be kind... Getting them ready for first grade! It is coming soon!

### 1<sup>st</sup> Grade

First grade is loving their Geometry unit in math – very engaging for the students! A mapping unit was just started that will coincide with the ever popular Flat Stanley/Flat First Grader adventures. Starting this Thursday and going each week through June is our new Art rotations.

Children will rotate each Thursday from 2:15-2:45 to a different first grade teacher for art. We are so excited for this!

We're also doing a bit of composing and transcribing (2nd/3rd) in preparation for a unit later in the year where students work in small groups and use these skills. <u>*K*/1</u>: singing, moving, melodic contour.
