Chair Update 2017-2018

- A group reached out for Variety Show but still no one has committed to being the lead or coordinator for this. For now we have not added this back in as an activity for the school, but are open to it if a lead or committee comes forward to run it.
- All chair positions filled for next year.
- Spring event going forward will be a cap to OSOB and be run by that chair/committee.

Treasurer's Report (Angela Babst)

2017 - 2018 Proposed Budget - Review and discussion notes below. We will be voting on this budget at the June PTO meeting.

Assumptions:

- We will start the year with approximately \$42,000 in the bank. (This amount could be higher because we don't anticipate that all budgets from this year will be spent fully).
- 27 classrooms for next year. (Same as this year.) This will be reevaluated and updated once the state provides its budget for education.
- The \$12,000 sign/reader board for the front of the school that was approved this year will not be spent until next year.
- Jog-a-thon will bring in \$50,000 in revenue next year.

Large Changes from this year to next year:

- Staff Appreciation Increase from \$1,500 to \$3,000.
- Removed Artist in Residency and replaced with Assemblies. Decreased from \$11,000 to \$3,500.

- Added STEAM \$2,500. Removed Celebrate the Arts (\$600), and OMSI Planetarium Exhibit (\$600).
- Added Fifth Grade Activities \$3,500
- Added Green Team \$500
- Added Grade Level Funds \$4,200** See below for description**

Smaller Changes:

- Changed Barn Dance and Bollywood to Fall Event and Spring Event. Consolidated the smaller line items related to these events.
- Field Day Mr. Arnold requested an increase from \$100 to \$200.
- Running Club \$200 due to discussion about not pursuing the grant for next year.
- Art Literacy Decrease from \$3,200 to \$2,500. Did not spent full budget this year, and \$2,500 was suggested by current chair.
- Author Visits Decrease from \$4,000 to \$3,000.
- OSOB Decrease from \$5,000 to \$4,000.
- Removed Battle of the Books. Now running through district instead of PTO.
- Maintained classroom reimbursements of \$300 per classroom teacher. Started the year at \$200 per classroom, but increased after jog-a-thon.
- Increase Taxes from \$450 to \$550.
- Removed items that were specific to this year Solar Eclipse (\$850), Apple TV Equip (\$3,600), Silverware(\$500).

Based on these changes and assumptions, we estimate approximately \$27,000 would be remaining in the bank account at the end of the year.

**Grade Level funds is \$700 per grade level. This will be required to be spent as a grade level team to benefit all classrooms within that grade. We were asked to provide money for subscriptions (i.e. Time for Kids, Scholastic News, etc), but the amount required varied significantly by grade, and some grade levels use subscription magazines more than others. Some teachers requested more books for their pods instead of magazines. In an effort to be fair and still meet the needs, we propose this line item for the teachers. This allows each grade level to meet and make a decision how they will use the money. They can choose books, subscriptions, or something else. Our requirement is that it benefit the entire grade level. The \$700 was determined by looking at what it costs to get a subscription for a grade level.

Question from Dan Silver: Did ESL go up to \$300 like the classroom teachers? Not at this time, just classroom teachers. After discussion we decided to increase both ESL teachers to \$300 by moving \$100 to each of them from the Student Supervisor line item (\$200 total) since we no longer have a Student Supervisor position.

Member At Large (Jyothy Vemuri)

Mrs. Guevara (4th grade teacher) was contacted by Eco School who may want to donate something to help our green team...Jyothy will follow up with her.

Miscellaneous Items/New Business:

Need to clean up the PTO workroom - everything on top of cabinets needs to be moved down so it doesn't cause a hazard. Need to move stuff from stage into workroom. Carnival and Barn Dance props and games have a new home, Merideth to confirm where that is (Wendy Gibson had indicated that she found a new home for them). Amy Roskowski will organize a cleaning party to go through everything.

Discussed what to do with old laptop computers that came with the Secretary and Treasurer positions. Neither computer has been used in last 2-3 years. Bradi has volunteered scanning services in order to keep any necessary financial records. Merideth went through the files on the Secretary's computer and moved any pertinent ones to Google Drive associated with the secretary@jacobwismerpto.org email. Dan Silver could make use of both laptops in his classroom, and since they are no longer of value or use to the PTO we will donate to him to rebuild and use.
