Treasurer's Report (Angela Babst)

2017 - 2018 Proposed Budget - There was only one change made to the budget after last month's discussion:

• Eliminate student supervisor money and reallocate that amount to ESL teachers. This was a budget neutral change that we had discussed at the May PTO meeting.

Question: Do we know the classroom numbers for next year.

Answer: Right now the district has Jacob Wismer budgeted 26 teachers:

- 4 Kindy classrooms
- 4 1st Grade classrooms
- 5 2nd & 3rd Grade classrooms
- 4 4th & 5th grade classrooms

Joan has requested 2 more teachers, but that has not been confirmed yet. Not sure when we'll know. Teacher reimbursements in the budget will be adjusted when we receive the final staffing numbers from the district.

Megan Leahy (1st grade) Her position was a temporary position, so unfortunately it was not renewed for next year.

Gabe Martin - Will move to Eugene - got an IA from Cedar Park to replace him.

Wendy Bax - Moving to Nancy Ryles - getting 1/2 ESL in her place

Sandy Reimer - Experienced teacher from VOSE will be joining the staff

Question: How do class numbers for Jacob Wismer compare with other elementary schools in the district? **Answer/Discussion**: Classroom size information is posted in a Google doc for the district, and Joan is working to enlighten on how many of our classrooms are near or above 30 students.

Lots of changes happen over the summer (students in and out). The district holds some positions to see how classroom sizes look in September, and then those positions are opened up for schools with the biggest needs. In October, there are no more changes/additions to staff.

Question: Is there anything parents can do to advocate for more teachers? **Answer:** There really isn't much that can be done at the district level - the best thing to do would be to talk to state legislators and congress people in order to help get funding for education increased for all of Oregon.

Question: Is there an official upper limit for how many kids can be in class. Answer: No

Question: Is state considering how many are migrating to Oregon over the other states in the nation? **Answer/Discussion:** Not sure on this. Another consideration will be how measure 98 will be funded. It's unclear at this point whether it will come out of the existing 8.2 billion allocated, or funded from somewhere else in the state budget.

Question: Balance at the end of 2018 is lower than our ending balance this year. Is that because we are we expecting more funds to be spent next year, or less income or both? **Answer:** The main difference is for the reader board that PTO is giving to the school this year, but could not be installed next year so that money is still in the budget. Also, estimates for Jogathon are forecasted as less that we made this year just to be conservative.

Motion to approve budget was made by Jen Politsch, seconded by Amy Charon. Approved unanimously by all. Thank you Angela for your work on this!

Miscellaneous Items/New Business:

Question: Can we allocate funds for allowing innovative projects at the classroom or grade level? **Answer:** We encourage teachers to let the PTO know when they have ideas for things like this (i.e. Patty Blechman's eclipse project). If we have the funds we are happy to hear the

requests and look for opportunities to help teachers with this so they are not required to prepare grant proposals to the BEF in order to fund their project ideas. Typically these projects would benefit the whole school. Maybe next year we need to add line item per class for an "innovative' project? We could create a template for this to make it easier for teachers to request for these kinds of projects. We can revisit these ideas and adding this as a line item to the budget after next year's Jogathon.

Kindergarten

Music

5th, 4th, 3rd, 2nd: This is the time of year we do a little work on composing with guidelines. Students form small groups (up to 4 people, or may work by themselves). Groups select a picture and then instruments. Your goal is to create a soundscape that matches your picture. We post all of the selected pictures (and add a couple to throw people off) then each group takes a turn to performs their 'soundscape', and afterward the rest of the class tries to guess which picture was being represented. It's a popular lesson.

K/1st: We're doing one last new singing game, kids love "Doggie Doggie, Where's Your Bone?" It's an easy way to get students to sing by themselves. We also bring back any of the favorite games from the year.

All grades: practicing songs for our sing along
