**Clothes Closet Volunteering Day** 

Jacob Wismer's scheduled day to help staff the Beaverton's School District's Clothes Closet is Wednesday, January 8th. The Clothes Closet is operated by volunteers to provide clothes for kids in need who attend schools in the District. January 8th is our only scheduled day for the school year, and we are responsible for staffing from 9:30am to 4:15pm. Roughly speaking, we are looking for volunteers for two shifts: 9:30am to 12:45pm, or second shift of 12:45pm to 4:15pm. But if you can volunteer for even a couple of hours, that would be very helpful. Volunteers in the afternoon are especially needed. Three to four people are needed for each shift. Tasks include sorting clothing that's been donated, keeping the room neat, helping families find what they're looking for, etc. An orientation will be provided, and staff are there to assist. Please consider helping out!

## Middle School Boundary Adjustment

Those of you who follow the PTO Facebook page will be aware that the BSD Middle School Boundary Adjustment committee has raised the possibility of sending JW students to a new middle school (Timberline) rather than to Stoller, or of splitting JW to feed into both middle schools.

A number of parents have organized to make sure JW is represented at the next Middle School Boundary Adjustment Committee meeting (Jan. 9<sup>th</sup>, 6:30-8:30 pm at Mountain View Middle School; doors open at 6 pm). Priya Mani has been chosen to speak for JW if given the chance. We encourage JW parents to attend this meeting if interested. If you do attend, please enter Priya's name into the speaker lottery to increase the chance that she will be allowed to speak. The message being promoted, using BSD is that all JW kids including those in SUMMA should attend Stoller while Stoller overcrowding must be reduced.

There is also a meeting tentatively scheduled for this Sunday at Cedar Mill Library (NOT the Bethany branch). More details will be announced shortly.

### **Film Plastic Recycling Competition**

Our Green Team challenge for January is to **recycle film plastic**! JW is competing against other elementary schools to see who can keep the most film plastic out of landfills. This type of plastic is not eligible for curbside recycling in our area, and it's a major pollutant in oceans. Even if properly disposed of in a landfill, it takes an incredibly long time to biodegrade. Keep your ziplocs and bread bags out of the trash – send them to our film plastic collection bins to start a new life in Trex building materials!

- Where? Yellow bins outside of JW office
- When? Bins will be up by Jan. 13<sup>th</sup>; collection continues through April 15<sup>th</sup>
- What? You can recycle these materials (please make sure they are clean, dry, and free of food residue):

grocery bags, bread bags, case overwrap, dry cleaning bags, newspaper sleeves, ice bags, wood pellet bags, ziplock & other re-sealable bags, produce bags, bubble wrap, salt bags, and cereal bags

Keep an eye out for our Fantastic Plasticometer, which will track how much plastic we've kept out of the landfill! Start collecting your film plastics now—you will be amazed by how much you've been throwing away!


