Green Club

November is almost here, and that means it's time for a new sustainability challenge! **Our theme for November is Local & Seasonal Food.**

- Food produced locally doesn't have be shipped far, reducing greenhouse gas emissions due to transport
- Transport can cause spoilage and waste of food, and often requires refrigeration and extra packaging
- Food that is bought out of season must either be shipped from far away, or preserved somehow. Both of these options increase its environmental impact!

Local and seasonal food choices can taste wonderful: produce items are often fresher and better-tasting because they are allowed to ripen in the fields rather than being picked unripe to allow transport. And buying local supports your neighborhood businesses and economy!

Worried because the local Farmer's Market is closed for the winter? Don't be. You won't even have to visit a specialty or high-end grocery to find local food choices, although there are a number of farms and stores nearby that sell local produce and meat. Even mainstream grocers such as Safeway, Fred Meyer and QFC carry items such as local produce and dairy products. Check the labels on the produce bins or the shelves for the "local" sign! So consider making this year's Thanksgiving a celebration of local and seasonal food, and eat local for November!
