### **Green Club**

Our challenge for December is to **Reduce Packaging!** During the holiday season, it can be really hard not to generate piles of waste. All those bags, boxes, wrapping papers... not to mention the cardboard and plastic packaging around food items and gifts. Packaging uses up resources in several ways: it takes raw materials and energy to produce packaging; transporting the packaging takes extra energy and causes extra emissions; and disposing of packaging after use also takes resources. Even recycling requires energy (both for processing and for transportation) and water. Plastic packaging is particularly bad—normal plastic doesn't biodegrade easily, so it remains in the environment for a long time.

This December, go green and do your part to **reduce**, **reuse and recycle packaging** whenever possible!

• Reduce! Choose items with little or no packaging: bulk produce instead of produce in

- clamshells, toys that are not packaged instead of those in multiple layers of boxes and plastic bags.
- Paper is better than plastic: paper products biodegrade quickly, while most plastic breaks down slowly. Choose paper when possible if you must use single-use items.
- Reuse! Wrap your presents with reusable packaging: you can use even normal gift bags and tissue paper over and over again! Just stick a new to/from sticker on the bag and it's as good as new. You can reuse stick-on bows on many presents as well—just add tape.
- Recycle! While recycling isn't as good as not using packaging in the first place, it sure
  beats sending trash to the landfill. Recycle what waste you can, and remember that many
  organizations (Boy Scouts, etc.) offer programs to recycle hard-to-deal-with items such
  as Christmas trees and holiday lights.
