Middle School Boundary Adjustment

The BSD Middle School Boundary Adjustment committee is nearing the end of its public meetings! If you haven't yet commented on the current maps – or even if you have – NOW is the time to make your voice heard. The boundary adjustment will affect EVERY student:

- JW is likely to remain at Stoller (not guaranteed), but who else will be at Stoller with us?
- Will Stoller be overcrowded in the future?
- How will high school feeder patterns be impacted?

At this point, Stoller composition might go many different ways, and the leading possibilities are:

1. SATO, Jacob Wismer, and All/Partial Springville

2. SATO, Jacob Wismer, and All/Partial Findley

*Due to the high level of interest in the JW community, the PTO will be reporting the stance of the parent group leading the JW community efforts with regard to the MS boundary adjustment. Updates provided by the parent group will be clearly marked as coming from the MS Boundary parent team.

The following is provided to spread information on behalf of the JW parent community. This information was provided to us by the MS Boundary parent team. Please make up your own mind and act accordingly!

The upcoming BSD meeting on 2/25 is likely going to decide whether we get to keep JW intact at Stoller <u>OR</u> with summa leaving, break our school, take down our strength, take away our overlaps for HS feeders and our friends. Not to mention that Stoller may end up overcrowded again within just a few years!

To prevent this, please COMMENT! Short comments are fine! They do not need to be fine oratory or masterly presentations of data. Comment to show BSD your thinking on this issue. You can submit multiple comments, even multiple comments every day! (But don't cut and paste—duplicate comments will be deleted.) Other schools are submitting literally hundreds of comments. We need to show BSD that we care about this issue too!

If we don't all comment now, after next Tuesday we will not be able to do much to affect the course the boundary adjustment will take. We expect to see a mashup of maps A and C; how favorable the mashup is to JW will depend on the strength and number of our comments to BSD!

Film Plastic Recycling Competition

Our JW community has collected 87 lbs of plastic so far! Go Eagles!!! Keep up the great work!

RUNNING TOTAL: 87.0 lbs plastic!

When we proposed participating in this competition, BSD was concerned that the bins would collect dirty, yucky trash. The JW community has done an AMAZING job of putting only clean, dry plastic in the yellow bin! Thank you so much!! However, there has been a lot of non-recyclable plastic in the bin. We know it's confusing, so there is an expanded guide to what you can and can't recycle in this week's newsletter. See below for the simple rule of thumb and some examples!

JW is competing against other elementary schools to see who can keep the most film plastic out of landfills. This type of plastic is not eligible for curbside recycling in our area, and it's a major pollutant in oceans. Even if properly disposed of in a landfill, it takes an incredibly long time to biodegrade. Keep your ziplocs and bread bags out of the trash – send them to our film plastic collection bins to start a new life in Trex building materials!

- Where? Yellow bins outside of JW office
- When? Bins are up now; collection continues through April 15th
- What? You can recycle these materials (please make sure they are clean, dry, and free of food residue):

grocery bags, bread bags, case overwrap, dry cleaning bags, newspaper sleeves, ice bags, wood pellet bags, ziplock & other re-sealable bags, produce bags, bubble wrap, salt bags, and cereal bags

Please note: You can recycle plastic Amazon mailer bags too! (Consider removing the sticker with your address if you're concerned about privacy.)

These items are NOT recyclable: plastic clamshells; chip bags and plastic-and-metal laminate bags; any plastic bags that don't pass the rule of thumb stretch test, such as cut salad bags and bags of dal or spices.

RULE OF THUMB: If you try to tear the plastic (you can also try to poke a hole with your finger)....plastic that STRETCHES can be recycled; plastic that BREAKS OR TEARS CLEANLY can't be recycled.

(From Trex: Trex uses a polyethylene plastic type. These items are generally a softer, somewhat "stretchy" plastic, usually with a less shiny finish. If torn, it would stretch and pull as it tears, giving a ragged edge; for example, a grocery bag or dry cleaning bag. If labeled, it would have a 2 or 4 recycling symbol. This is the type of plastic we are looking for. Plastics that are harder and "crinkly" that would give you a straight finish when torn, are plastics that we <u>cannot</u> use.)
