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Talk by literacy expert Dr. Mary Ehrenworth

What you do at Night, on the Weekends, and on Vacation Can Make a World of Difference to Your Child's Academic Success: Practical Advice for Families from a Leading Literacy Expert Grades K-8

Join Dr. Mary Ehrenworth on Wednesday, February 12th at Springville K-8 to find out how parents can make a tremendous difference in their children's academic success, now, and as they mature. Dr. Ehrenworth is the author of dozens of books, including *The Power of Grammar* and the best-selling *Pathways to the Common Core,* and most recently, *Essential Research Skills for Teens, Critical Literacy,* and, forthcoming, *The Civically-Engaged Classroom: Teaching in Times of Strife and Discord.* Among her more recent articles in *Educational Leadership* are: *Revisiting Reading Workshop: Autonomy, Liberation, and Love; Growing Extraordinary Writers; Why Argue?* and *Unlocking the Secrets of Complex Texts.* She is also a parent of two children who are widely diverse learners.

Middle School Boundary Adjustment

The BSD Middle School Boundary Adjustment committee is nearing the end of its public meetings! At the latest meeting, the committee voted to advance Map C, although many committee members favored Map A. Your comments matter! While Map A reflects the map advanced at the end of the previous committee meeting, Map C is much closer to reflecting what the JW community has been requesting via comments. The parents leading the JW community efforts with regard to the boundary adjustments have focused on three key themes: reducing overcrowding at Stoller; maintaining walkability; and retaining SUMMA at Stoller. Film Plastic Recycling Competition

We were blown away by how much plastic JW families have collected--more than 50 lbs in our first two weeks!!! Go Eagles!!! Keep up the great work!

RUNNING TOTAL: 50.6 lbs plastic!

JW is competing against other elementary schools to see who can keep the most film plastic out of landfills. This type of plastic is not eligible for curbside recycling in our area, and it's a major pollutant in oceans. Even if properly disposed of in a landfill, it takes an incredibly long time to biodegrade. Keep your ziplocs and bread bags out of the trash – send them to our film plastic collection bins to start a new life in Trex building materials!

- Where? Yellow bins outside of JW office
- When? Bins are up now; collection continues through April 15th
- What? You can recycle these materials (please make sure they are clean, dry, and free of food residue):

grocery bags, bread bags, case overwrap, dry cleaning bags, newspaper sleeves, ice bags, wood pellet bags, ziplock & other re-sealable bags, produce bags, bubble wrap, salt bags, and cereal bags

Please note: You can recycle plastic Amazon mailer bags too! (Consider removing the sticker with your address if you're concerned about privacy.)

Keep an eye out for our Fantastic Plasticometer, which will track how much plastic we've kept out of the landfill! Start collecting your film plastics now—you will be amazed by how much you've been throwing away!
