This week every student will receive a collection envelope to take home. We encourage you all to **register your students online at www.pledgestar.com/jacobwismer** and use this platform to send emails to family and friends asking for their support of our fundraising efforts. You can also use the envelope to submit any donations received in the form of cash or checks made out to **Jacob Wismer Elementary PTO**. Students are asked to return their envelopes to their classroom teachers during the week of October 14-18. The last day to qualify for incentive prizes is October 18th.

Another change to this years' event is that students will run/walk/jog the full figure eight of the track, just like they do in PE Class and in Running Club. We realize this may affect any "per lap" pledges students may receive, as they will likely run less laps than in previous years when they only ran either the upper or lower track and not both. Please be reminded of this so that you can notify any of your "per lap" donors.

Volunteers are needed on event day to help with set up, tear down, and logistics. Each classroom will need parents to help get kids organized and ready to run, help count laps, and cheer on students and staff as they make their way around the track. We typically require 5-6 volunteers per classroom. Parents are also needed to help monitor students during PE classes so that our amazing PE teachers can be available on the track.
